Effective Jan. 1, 2025

DAYS: Days shall mean total days irrespective of weekends and holidays.

**WRITTEN NOTICE**: Written notice is defined to include any representation of words, letters, symbols, numbers or figures, whether printed in or inscribed on a tangible medium or stored in an electronic form or other medium.

When the PR elects to hold a hearing instead of accepting the administrative penalty (first offence for classes 1-5), the hearing charge is \$750. A deposit of \$250 is due with the written request to hold a hearing. The hearing panel can determine to increase this amount up to \$5,000 on a case-by-case basis.

A second or third offence for the PR is applicable for any class of violation and/or any prohibited substance found for a second or third time in the same horse or different horses.

\*All prizes, ribbons and prize money won by the horse at the competition must be returned to the competition organizing committee where the infraction occurred.

\*The PR and the horse will be placed NGS for the duration of the suspension and until all fines and hearing fees are paid in full.

\* If there are multiple horses involved, the penalty should apply to each Horse and run consecutively.

\*\* Must appear before the Hearing Panel and provide proof of rehabilitation before being eligible to regain membership.

\*\*\* Illegal equipment are modifications to tack/equipment to cause intentional pain or injury with the objective of punishment or to enhance performance as well as any equipment or accessories that admit or cause electric shock.

The penalty types and ranges below are simple guidelines and are not mandatory. These guidelines are intended to provide a basis upon which discretion can be exercised consistently in like circumstances but are not binding on the Hearing Committee Panels. Depending on the facts and circumstances of each case, a Hearing Committee Panel may determine that no purpose is served by imposing a penalty at all. Conversely, a Hearing Committee Panel may determine that the facts and circumstances of a specific case may call for the imposition of penalties above or outside of the stated range. Examples include, but not are limited to, prior rule violations, egregious misconduct, the need for increased deterrence, or certain policy considerations.
