Pathway for Officials

This document outlines the process for obtaining EC credentials as a Dressage & Para Dressage Steward. Details on maintaining steward status as well as developing and progressing are also explained.

Section 1 – Apprentice Status: Requirements to Obtain and Maintain Apprentice Status

A. Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Minimum age: 19 years
- 2. Languages: English and/or French
- 3. Current EC Sport Licence holder (minimum Bronze) in good standing with EC
 - i. Completion of EC Safe Sport modules: Fostering Healthy Equestrian Environments, Concussion Awareness

B. Application Requirements

- 1. Applicants must submit an online application through their MyEC account for each status they would like to pursue.
 - i. Provide the name of the Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Steward supporting the application.
 - ii. Upload an equestrian CV/letter of application outlining experience and interest, including any related education.
 - iii. Payment of application fee as per EC schedule of fees (Note: officials fee not required for Apprentices).



C. Privileges

- 1. Apprentice is listed on the EC Officials Roster as Dressage/Para Dressage Apprentice Steward.
- 2. Once accredited, the Apprentice may commence application requirements toward Basic status.
- 3. Apprentices may remain listed on EC Officials Roster as current for a minimum of one Year (12 months) to maximum of three (3) years (36 months). If the candidate has not applied and been accepted as a Basic Dressage/Para Dressage Steward at the end of 3 years from the time of Apprentice application, the file will be retired.
- 4. A Senior Steward will be assigned by EC to the Apprentice for guidance.
- 5. Participate in the Apprentice Program in preparation for application to Basic status.

D. Apprentice Program Learning Outcomes: minimum 1 Year (12 months), maximum 3 years (36 months)

- 1. Foundations: the role of Equestrian Canada Officials in Dressage and Para Dressage.
- 2. Introduction to management of discipline specific EC Rulebooks and EC Policies.
- 3. Introduction to practical skills: example, Active Observation; equipment and dress checks.
- 4. Introduction to basic competition management.
- 5. Biosecurity basics in equestrian competition
- 6. Understanding animal welfare, the horse in a competition environment
- 7. Introduction to conflict management

E. Maintenance Requirements

- 1. Remain in good standing with EC.
- 2. Maintain annual EC Sport Licence.
- 3. Attest to remain in Apprentice Program.
- 4. Provide proof of continued learning program for each year.

Section 2 – Basic Status: Requirements to Obtain and Maintain Basic Status

A. Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Minimum age: 20 years
- 2. Languages: English and/or French
- 3. Current EC Sport Licence holder (minimum Gold) in good standing with EC.
 - i. Maintain EC Safe Sport modules: Fostering Healthy Equestrian Environments, Concussion Awareness
 - ii. Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC) consent and onboarding.
- 4. Have been listed as a Dressage/Para Dressage Apprentice Steward for a minimum of one year (12 months).



5. Successful completion of the Apprentice Program learning outcomes as evidenced by the evaluation reports

B. Application Requirements*

- 1. Applicants must submit an online application through their MyEC account for each status they would like to pursue. Including:
 - i. Name of Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Steward supporting the application.
 - ii. Payment of application fee as per EC schedule of fees.
- 2. All application requirements must be completed within three years (36 months) of Apprentice application.
- 3. Clinics
 - i. Applicants must attend and complete an EC promotion clinic, including preassignments, and receive a favourable evaluation in the year of application to Basic status.

4. Examination

- i. Pass a written examination with a score of 80% or higher.
- ii. In the event that the Apprentice time extends beyond one Sport Licence renewal, Apprentices will also be required to complete an annual online rules exam for EC Officials Dressage/Para Dressage when renewing licences.

5. Continued Education

- i. Applicants must complete as required mandatory educational units as listed annually for Apprentices.
 - 1. Examples: Understanding Equestrian Canada Equine Medication Control, World Horse Welfare Webinars – Bridle fit with Dr. Rachel Morey

6. Apprenticing

- i. Must apprentice a minimum of eight (8) complete EC-sanctioned competition days at a minimum of two (2) different venues and with two (2) different organizers.
 - 1. A Competition Day is defined as one hour prior to first ride time of the day and finishing ½ hour following the posting of final results for that day and/or end-of-day officials meeting.
- ii. Applicants must apprentice with a minimum of three (3) different Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Stewards.
- iii. Applicants must receive three positive apprentice evaluation reports.
 - 1. Evaluation reports can be from a single day or multi day competition.
- iv. Applicants must complete a minimum of two Stable Monitoring Checklists during apprenticing, to be done with and reviewed by the Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Steward with whom the applicant is apprenticing.
- v. All apprentice evaluation reports, and checklist forms must be completed and signed by the Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Steward with whom the applicant is apprenticing, as well as signed by the applicant.



- vi. Evaluation reports and checklists from each of the apprenticeships must be submitted to EC by the applicant in their complete application package.
- vii. Applicants must be listed as "officials not listed in the prize list" on the Steward Report for the competitions where they apprentice.
- 7. Once all application requirements are complete, applicants must submit their complete application package to EC for consideration of promotion to Basic status.
 - i. Application package must include
 - 1. Copies of all evaluation reports and checklists from apprenticing.
 - 2. Copies of all prize lists from competitions where applicant apprenticed.
 - ii. Partial or incomplete application packages will not be considered.

C. Privileges/Support/Evaluation

- 1. Privileges During Basic Probationary Year (12 months)
 - i. All newly promoted Basic stewards will have one probationary year.
 - ii. Basic stewards in their probationary year may officiate alone at Bronze or Silver competitions with one single competition ring and must provide a Steward Report to EC from each competition.
 - iii. Basic stewards in their probationary year may officiate at Bronze, Silver or Gold competitions with a Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Steward. The Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Stewards at a minimum one of these competitions must provide a completed evaluation report to EC following each event.
- 2. Support During Basic Probationary Year (12 months)
 - i. The Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Steward assigned to Basic steward as an Apprentice will continue to be available to them for advice in their probationary year.
- 3. Evaluation During Basic Probationary Year (12 months)
 - i. EC will review all probationary steward's Competition Steward Report and conduct regular surveys throughout your probationary period.
 - ii. In the final months (9-12) of their probationary year, the Basic Steward is to provide a complete self-evaluation using the steward evaluation report to EC.
 - iii. Assist in a minimum of 2 Pony Measurements as per EC General Regulations, Article A1105 (applicant to maintain copies of measurement cards).
- 4. Privileges following Basic Probationary Year
 - i. After a successful probationary year, Basic steward may steward alone or on a team at Bronze, Silver, Gold competitions.
 - ii. No limit on how many years a Basic steward may remain at this level as long as currency is maintained.

D. Maintenance Requirements

- 1. Remain in good standing with EC.
- 2. Maintain annual EC Sport Licence and pay annual officials licence fees.
- 3. Attend an EC Dressage/Para Dressage Stewards clinic at minimum every three years (36 months) receiving a favourable report and pass an associated written examination with a score of 80% or higher.



- 4. Annually, beginning in the probationary year, complete a minimum of two (2) continued education units from those listed for Basic stewards.
- 5. Pass an annual Rules examination by March 31 each year (assigned December 1).
- 6. Officiate as a Basic Dressage/Para Dressage Steward at a minimum of four separately licensed competitions every 3 years (36 months) as follows:
 - i. One Gold Dressage/Para Dressage competition
 - ii. Three other/additional competitions (Bronze, Silver and/or including Gold)
 - 1. One competition can be from either: Dressage phase of Eventing/Combined or Breeds: Dressage)

*Exception:

Potential applicants with Advanced standing may be considered for advancement on a case by case evaluation of skills/knowledge/experience in which case a specific pathway may be assigned

Section 3 – Senior Status: Requirements to Obtain and Maintain Senior Status

A. Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Minimum age: 20 years
- 2. Languages: English and/or French
- 3. Current EC Sport Licence holder (minimum Gold) in good standing with EC.
- 4. Have been licensed as a Basic Dressage/Para Dressage Steward for a minimum of two years (24 months) following probationary period (minimum of 36 months total), as long as currency has been and is maintained.
- 5. Have officiated as a Basic Dressage/Para Dressage Steward at a minimum of ten (10) EC sanctioned Dressage/Para Dressage competitions, as follows:
 - i. Six (6) of which must be Gold and/or Platinum. Three (3) of those must include FEI classes/divisions (*Small, Medium and/or Big Tour*)
 - 1. Copies of order of go will be required.
 - ii. Up to four (4) of which may be a Bronze or Silver AND one (1) of which may be a Breed specific or Eventing Dressage Phase competition.
 - iii. Of the ten competitions, there must be a variety of locations and venues, and at least one competition outside of the applicant's home province is preferred.

B. Application Requirements

- 1. Applicants must submit an online application through their MyEC account for each status they would like to pursue.
 - i. Payment of application fee as per schedule of fees
- 2. Clinics
 - Applicants must attend and complete an EC promotion clinic, including preassignments, and receive a favourable evaluation in the year of application to Senior status.
- 3. Examination
 - i. Pass a written examination with a score of 85% or higher.

4. Continued Education

- i. Applicants must complete as required mandatory educational units as listed annually for Apprentices.
 - 1. Example: *Understanding Equestrian Canada Equine Medication Control.*
- Applicant must have officiated as a Basic steward on a steward team of three (3), including a Senior/FEI Dressage/Para Dressage Steward, at minimum of one EC Gold Dressage/Para Dressage competition. OR

Applicant must have **shadowed** as a Basic steward with a Senior/FEI Dressage/Para-Dressage Steward at a minimum of one two-day EC Dressage/Para Dressage competition or two one-day EC Dressage/Para-Dressage competitions.

- i. A steward evaluation report must be submitted by the Senior lead steward to EC in either case.
- 6. Once all application requirements are complete, applicants must submit their complete application package to EC for consideration of promotion to Senior status.
 - i. Application package must include
 - 1. Copies of all evaluation reports.
 - 2. Copies of all prize lists from competitions where applicant apprenticed.
 - 3. Copies of all orders of go from Gold/Platinum where applicant officiated.
 - ii. Partial or incomplete application packages will not be considered.

C. Privileges/Evaluation

- 1. Privileges During Senior Probationary Year (12 months)
 - i. All newly promoted Senior stewards will have one probationary year.
 - ii. Senior stewards may officiate at all EC Dressage/Para Dressage competitions including Championships and assist at Canadian FEI CDI in accordance with FEI regulations and approval.
 - iii. No limit on how many years a Senior steward may remain at this level as long as currency is maintained.
- 2. Evaluation During Senior Probationary Year (12 months)
 - i. Peer evaluation by one Senior/FEI Dressage/Para Dressage Steward during probationary year.
 - 1. The probationary steward may shadow/apprentice or be on the competition officials roster at the competition.

D. Maintenance Requirements

- 1. Remain in good standing with EC.
- 2. Maintain annual EC Sport Licence and pay annual officials licence fees.
- 3. Attend an EC Dressage/Para Dressage Stewards clinic at minimum every three years (36 months) receiving a favourable report and pass an associated written examination with a score of 85% or higher.
- 4. Annually, beginning in the probationary year, complete a minimum of two (2) continued education units from those listed for Senior stewards.



- 5. Pass an annual Rules examination by March 31 each year (assigned December 1).
- 6. Officiate as a Senior Dressage/Para Dressage Steward at a minimum of three EC sanctioned Gold and/or Platinum competitions every 3 years (36 months).
- 7. Senior stewards must be available to assist with mentoring roles for Apprentices as requested.
