

2024 OLYMPIC GAMES EQUESTRIAN CANADA NOMINATION CRITERIA & PROCEDURES DRESSAGE

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Internal Nomination Procedures (INP) for the Olympic Games (2024 OG) will be communicated through Equestrian Canada (EC) official publications, posted on the EC website, and distributed by email to EC National Team Program (NTP) athletes.
- The purpose of this document is to set out the nomination criteria and procedures (Nomination Criteria) that will be used by EC to nominate athlete/horse combinations to compete at the 2024 OG scheduled for July 26th August 11th, 2024, in Paris France.
- 1.3 Discipline specific Nomination Criteria are outlined in *Appendix 1*. Questions specific to the Nomination Criteria should be directed to the appropriate Discipline Manager (DM).
- 1.4 Athlete/horse combinations must meet the expectations as outlined in these Nomination Criteria in order to be considered for nomination.
- 1.5 Athletes and owners who choose to participate in the nomination process acknowledge by their participation and declaration that meeting the requirements outlined in these Nomination Criteria does not guarantee that an athlete/horse combination will be nominated.
- 1.6 It is vitally important for the integrity of the nomination process that athletes, grooms, owners, team support personnel and associated parties involved in the nomination process, practice at all times, a high degree of confidentiality relating to information which may have a bearing on nomination, and/or any nomination decisions. All confidential information, conversations, and discussions will be identified as such. Any person who breaks this confidentiality may be removed from the process.
- 1.7 If there is a difference in interpretation between the French and English versions of this document, then the English version shall prevail.
- 1.8 Any intentional misrepresentation of information submitted for nomination consideration may, in the sole discretion of EC, eliminate the athlete/horse combination from both the qualifying process and from consideration for nomination.

2. ELIGIBILITY

2.1 To be eligible for nomination consideration for the 2024 OG, the following minimum eligibility requirements listed in this section must be met.



2.2 Athlete

- Be a Canadian citizen at the time of declaration and until the conclusion of the 2024 OG.
- Have a Canadian passport that is valid until at least <u>February 11th</u>, 2025.
- Be eligible to travel to any required staging/quarantine camp and the 2024 OG.
- Be in compliance with all relevant International Federation (FEI) and International Olympic Committee (IOC) requirements for eligibility.
- Sign, submit and comply with the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) Athlete Agreement and Organizing Committee Olympic Games (OCOG) Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than <u>June 24th, 2024.</u> Where the athlete is under the age of 19 years, the parent or guardian must also sign these agreements.
- Be a member in good standing (Platinum Sport Licence Holder) with EC.
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable. Requirements will be outlined in the COC participant agreement.
- Hold a current FEI Registration and be in good standing with the FEI.
- Sign, submit and comply with the EC Athlete Agreement and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the Universal Code for the Prevention of Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS) and the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC).
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines.
- Meet minimum athlete age requirements as per the 2024 FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events 25th edition ART 606.1:
 - Dressage: 16 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2008
 - Eventing: 18 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2006
 - Jumping: 18 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2006

2.3 Horse

- Meet minimum horse age requirements as per the 2024 FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events 25th edition ART 606.2.1:
 - Dressage: 8 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2016
 - Eventing: 8 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2016
 - Jumping: 9 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2015
- Possess a valid FEI Horse Registration Document (Passport) and be in good standing.
- As per ART 606.2.2.1 must have been registered with FEI as property of Owners of Canadian nationality on or before 15 January 2024.



2.4 Groom

- Be a minimum of 18 years of age at the time of the 2024 OG.
- Have a passport that is valid until at least **February 11th, 2025.**
- Be eligible to travel to any required staging/quarantine camp and the 2024 OG.
- Have experience competing or grooming at international equestrian competitions.
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines.
- Sign, submit and comply with the COC Support Staff Agreement and OCOG Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than <u>June 24th</u>, <u>2024.</u>
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable. Requirements will be outlined in the COC participant agreement.
- Agree and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the Universal Code for the Prevention of Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS) and the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC).

2.5 Owner

- Have a passport that is valid until at least **February 11th, 2025.**
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines.
- At minimum one Owner must be listed as an owner in the FEI horse passport.
- Sign, submit and comply with the COC Support Staff Agreement and OCOG Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than <u>June 24th</u>, 2024.
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable.
- Agree and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the Universal Code for the Prevention of Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS) and the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC).

2.6 Support Team Members

- Have a passport that is valid until at least February 11th, 2025.
- Be eligible to travel to any required staging/quarantine camp and the 2024 OG.
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines.
- Sign, submit and comply with the COC Support Staff Agreement and OCOG Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than <u>June 24th, 2024.</u>
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable. Requirements will be outlined in the COC participant agreement.
- Agree and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the Universal Code for the Prevention of Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS) and the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC).
- Note: To access "P" and Ao (coach) Accreditations the coach must be a Registered or Chartered Professional Coach with the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC) Professional Coaching Program. Eligibility for a Registered Coach License incudes a valid police information check, two professional references, safe sport training, an ethical conduct declaration and signing a license agreement.



3 DECLARATION AND ACCREDITATION PROCEDURES

Declaration

- 3.1 **Deadline Date:** Athletes must submit a declaration for the 2024 OG to EC through the EC Games Portal on or before 12 midnight ET, November 3rd, 2023. Failure to submit the required information and documents by this deadline will make the declaration incomplete and invalid. No late submissions will be accepted, with the exception as outlined in Section 3.5.
- 3.2 **Purpose:** The declaration date allows sufficient time for the **Accreditation Process** to be completed for athletes, grooms, owners, and support team personnel through the COC by IOC deadlines for all possible athletes, grooms, owners and support team members.
- 3.3 **Process:** The declaration MUST be made through the EC Games Portal at:
 - o New users (excluding Athletes): https://licence.equestrian.ca/gamesdb/register?user=new
 - o Existing users: https://licence.equestrian.ca/gamesdb/login.aspx
 - **3.3.1** Fees: Declaration fees, if any, are outlined in *Appendix 1*

3.4 Declaration Information

The athlete must provide the following information in their declaration:

- **3.4.1 Horses:** The name, FEI passport / recognition card number, and FEI passport/recognition card expiry date for each declared horse, Refer to Section 2.3 for horse eligibility.
- **3.4.2 Grooms:** The name, *unique e-mail address*, and phone number for a minimum of two (2) up to a maximum of four (4) declared grooms in priority order. Athletes are responsible for ensuring that their groom is qualified, kept informed, and available for the time commitments in the proposed schedule for 2024 OG (including an expected four week commitment over the time of the 2024 OG plus any potential quarantine / staging camp camp). EC reserves the right to deem a groom ineligible for an international team competition. Should a groom not carry out their assigned duties and obligations or exhibit inappropriate behavior detrimental to the team, then EC has the authority to remove such groom from the team. Refer to Section 2.4 for groom eligibility. Refer to the discipline specific Nomination Criteria in *Appendix 1* for additional groom information, as applicable.
- **3.4.3 Owners:** The name, *unique e-mail address*, and phone number <u>for up to two (2) declared owners per horse</u>, in priority order for accreditation purposes; at least one owner must be listed in the FEI passport/recognition card. In the case of syndicate ownership groups, declared athlete/horse owners do not need to be individually listed in the FEI passport/recognition card, but must be individually declared in priority for accreditation purposes. Refer to Section 2.5 for owner eligibility.

Failure to submit the required information and documents by the deadline will make the declaration incomplete and invalid. The declaration date allows sufficient time for the declared athletes, grooms, owners and support team personnel to be submitted to the COC in order to be eligible to complete the COC accreditation process within the required timelines. The accreditation process is outlined in Section 3.7 below.



3.5 Late Declarations:

3.5.1 Athletes: Athletes not declared on or before <u>12 midnight ET</u>, <u>November 3rd, 2023</u>, will not be eligible.

3.5.2 Horse(s):

- 3.5.2.1 In the case of a horse(s) being made available to an already declared athlete after the declaration deadline to form a "New Athlete/Horse combination", the High Performance Advisory Group (HPAG) may, in its sole discretion, accept this athlete/horse combination as a declared candidate for the 2024 OG no later than January 15th, 2024. Owner(s) of this horse may be eligible to apply for accreditation (subject to COC approval), and meeting the owner eligibility as set forth in 2.5.
- 3.5.2.2 In the case of a new horse(s) being made available to an already declared athlete after <u>January 15th, 2024 and prior to March 30th, 2024</u> to form a "New Athlete/Horse combination, the HPAG may, in its sole discretion, accept the athlete/horse combination as a declared candidate for the 2024 OG. <u>Owner(s) of this horse are not eligible to apply for accreditation.</u>

Note: "New Athlete/Horse Combination(s)" defined as either a:

- o new horse purchase or horse transfer to an already declared athlete.
- **3.6 Withdrawal:** Declared athletes who subsequently choose to withdraw from the nomination process (either themselves or their horse) prior to the naming of the team and alternates must advise the EC DM of their decision in writing.

3.7 Accreditation Process

- 3.7.1 Process: The accreditation process for the 2024 OG will be facilitated by EC and coordinated through the COC. To facilitate this process, the athlete declaration in the EC Games Portal must include the personal / unique email addresses and phone numbers for all potential grooms and owners. Any subsequent changes to accreditation details i.e. new owners, grooms etc. must be reported to the DM immediately in writing. Athletes, grooms, owners and team personnel are not permitted to apply directly to the COC or the OCOG for accreditation.
- **3.7.2 Allocation:** EC has the exclusive authority to nominate, and allocate accreditations for the grooms, owners, and team personnel who comprise the Canadian Equestrian Team (CET) to represent Canada at the 2024 OG. Accreditation for 2024 OG are limited and are allocated based on the needs of the entire team and on what EC feels will lead to the best team performance at the 2024 OG.
- **3.7.3 Information Deadline:** Athletes, grooms, owners, and team support personnel are to provide all necessary accreditation information, including photos, passport details and personal information, in the COC Games Portal in accordance with the process and the timelines of the COC and EC.
- 3.7.4 **Long List:** It is very important that information is provided and entered in the EC Games Portal for EVERY possible individual who may attend the 2024 OG in an accredited role (Athlete, Owner, Groom, Team Personnel etc.). Participation in the accreditation application process does not guarantee accreditation nor nomination.



3.8 Release of Liability Waiver

- 3.8. 1 All declared athletes, grooms, owners and team personnel must complete and return the release of liability waivers to the DM by <u>July 3rd, 2024</u>. The waiver and release forms can be found in the following appendices:
 - Appendix 2: Athlete Release of Liability, Waiver of Claims, Assumption of Risk & Indemnity Agreement
 - Appendix 3: Groom / Team Personnel Release of Liability, Waiver of Claims, Assumption of Risk & Indemnity Agreement
 - Appendix 4: Owner Release of Liability, Waiver of Claims, Assumption of Risk & Indemnity Agreement
 - Appendix 5: Release of Veterinary Medical Records (Dressage and Para-Dressage only)

4. ANTI-DOPING AND DRUG TESTING

Athlete

- **4.1 Eligibility:** The athlete must not be under suspension or any other sanction by any recognized body for any doping or doping-related offense.
- **4.2 Testing:** Declared athletes may be subject to announced and unannounced drug testing in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and EC rules and regulations. Testing includes both in-competition and out-of-competition testing. All athletes who declare for the nomination process must provide accurate and up-to-date contact information through the EC Sport Licence portal.
- **4.3 Deemed Violation:** Athletes who do not provide up-to-date contact information or respond to EC communications will be considered in violation of these policies. Violations will be considered in context by the Dressage HPAG and may result in the disqualification of the athlete from the nomination process.

Horse

- **4.4 Testing:** All declared horses shall be subject to drug testing according to FEI drug and medication rules. Blood and/or urine samples may be drawn at any time throughout the nomination and quarantine / staging camp periods. Samples may be tested for the presence for all prohibited and/or controlled substances by the FEI (see *Appendix 1*, Section 2.2.4.2).
- **4.5 Prohibited Substances:** In the event a prohibited substance is detected, the amount of this substance will be quantified where possible and reported to the DM. Any horse whose sample contains a prohibited substance or a restricted substance in a concentration greater than the allowable FEI limits may be eliminated from the nomination process by the HPAG. Positive test results from samples collected during FEI competitions will result in disqualification of the athlete/horse combination in all classes at that competition.

5. APPEALS

5.1 Grounds: Athletes participating in the nomination process for the 2024 OG have the right to appeal against a nomination decision but only on the grounds that the HPAG has failed to comply with the correct procedures outlined in the Nomination Criteria or have made a patently unreasonable decision based on the Nomination Criteria. An appeal must be made in writing to the Independent Third Party Complaint Manager within 72 hours of the relevant athlete being informed of the decision. Appeals must be accompanied by a non-refundable – administration fee of \$750.00 CAD as per the published EC Schedule of Fees. 5.2 Process: In recognition of the short timelines required for the nomination decision process, any appeals to decisions made under the Nomination Criteria will proceed under the Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC) appeal process. **The administration fee referred to in Section 5.1 will be applied to the fee required for the appeal to SDRCC.**

6. AMENDMENTS TO THE NOMINATION CRITERIA / EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES

- 6.1 The Nomination Criteria and procedures are based on applicable FEI, COC and OCOG regulations, conditions and restrictions as currently known and understood and on the latest information available to EC. Any changes in the Nomination Criteria and procedures necessitated by a change in FEI, COC or OCOG regulations will be distributed via email to all declared athletes as soon as reasonably possible. Should such a circumstance occur, EC will review and may amend Nomination Criteria to comply with the new regulations or conditions. Any amendments to this document will be communicated directly to all declared athletes via email. Communication will be sent to the email address provided in the EC Games Portal.
- 6.2 Further, situations may arise that do not allow this Nomination Criteria to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional and unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including nomination decisions, will be made by the individual(s) with decision-making authority, as stated in this Nomination Criteria, in consultation with the relevant individual(s) or committee(s) (as applicable), and in accordance with the stated performance objectives and nomination philosophy and approach as stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, EC will communicate with all declared athletes as soon as possible.



APPENDIX 1 - DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC NOMINATION CRITERIA

1. TEAM COMPOSITION

1.1. **Team Nomination:** EC plans to nominate a team (three athlete/horse combinations) to compete in the dressage competition at the 2024 OG.

In announcing the final nomination for the 2024 OG, where appropriate and indicated in the nomination criteria, EC will also announce alternate athletes who may be called to replace an athlete who is unable to compete at the 2024 OG for any reason. The athletes' information will be submitted to the COC at the same time as the nominated athletes' information.

- 1.2. **Individual Nomination:** Should Canada not obtain a team qualification slot for the 2024 OG or should Canada not have enough eligible athlete/horse combinations to form a team for the 2024 OG, then entry in the individual event would only occur in exceptional circumstances and only if the individual combination has achieved an average qualification score above 70%. The decision to send an individual(s) would still be subject to the recommendation and approval of the HPAG in consultation with the EC Director High Performance (DHP) and the DM, and in accordance with these qualification and nomination procedures and the regulations for the 2024 OG.
- 1.3. **Performance Objective**: The performance objective for the Canadian Dressage team at the 2024 OG is a team top 10 finish.

2. QUALIFICATION

- 2.1 **Qualification Period:** The Qualification Period (QP) for the 2024 OG shall run from **January 1st, 2024, to June 9th, 2024,** inclusive.
- 2.2 Qualification Process: Qualification of athlete/horse combinations for the 2024 OG will consist of a four-stage process:
 - 2.2.1 Stage One EC Declaration
 - 2.2.2 Stage Two FEI Minimum Eligibility Requirement (MER) Certificate of Capability
 - 2.2.3 Stage Three EC Qualification Score Requirements
 - 2.2.4 Stage Four EC Fitness Inspections

2.2.1 Stage One – EC Declaration

- 2.2.1.1 An athlete must have achieved a minimum threshold score of 67% in the Grand Prix test once from either a national (EC gold or equivalent foreign), or an international (EC platinum or FEI CDI) event with at least one of the horses they are declaring and must have submitted the 2024 OG Declaration and non-refundable declaration fee of \$500.00 CAD through the EC Games Portal on or before the declaration deadline 12 midnight EST November 3rd, 2023. Exception see Section 3.5 of the Nomination Criteria.
- 2.2.2.2 An athlete who has **NOT** achieved a minimum threshold score of 67% in the Grand Prix test once from either a national (EC gold or equivalent foreign), or an international (EC platinum or FEI CDI) event with at least one of the horses they are declaring, must submit the 2024 OG Declaration and non-refundable declaration fee of \$1,500.00 CAD through



the EC Games Portal on or before the declaration deadline <u>12 midnight EST</u>, <u>November</u> <u>3rd</u>, <u>2023</u>. Exception see Section 3.5 of the Nomination Criteria.

2.2.2 Stage Two – FEI Minimum Eligibility Requirement (MER) / Certificate of Capability

2.2.2.1. Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MER)

To be eligible to participate in the 2024 OG Dressage Competitions all Athletes/Horses must achieve, as a combination, the Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MER) at selected Events which take place from <u>1 January 2023 until (and including) 24 June 2024</u> (the "MER Deadline").

Athlete/Horse combination must fulfil the minimum eligibility requirements as described below.

A minimum 67% must be attributed twice to the Athlete/Horse combination by both a L4 judge and as an average from all judges in the competition, and the score must be achieved in a Grand Prix test at two different CDI3*/CDI4*/CDI5*/CDI-W/CDIO events.

The two L4 judges referred to above who award a minimum of 67% must be of a nationality other than of the Athlete.

Scores achieved in the Grand Prix classes (Consolation) judged by three Judges do not count towards the MER.

2.2.3 Stage Three – EC Qualification Score Requirements

- 2.2.3.1 Qualification scores must be achieved at CDI3*, or higher, competitions within the QP (see *Appendix 1*, Section 2.1).
- 2.2.3.2 Athlete/horse combinations must compete in a minimum of three (3) Grand Prix (GP), plus three (3) Grand Prix Special (GPS) classes in 2024 to be considered for nomination.
- 2.2.3.3 A minimum of one Grand Prix and one Grand Prix Special score must be achieved within the QP after April 1st, 2024, and must count towards the athlete's final ranking average. Scores achieved in the FEI Developing Grand Prix test will not be considered for nomination.
- 2.2.3.4 All qualification scores must be achieved from a panel of at least five FEI judges.

2.2.4 Stage Four – EC Fitness Inspections

- 2.2.4.1 Physician Assessment
 - As part of the nomination process the advice from the Team Physician, if so required, will be taken into consideration to ensure athletes considered for nomination are healthy and fit-to-compete.



2.2.4.2 Veterinary Assessment

- of the horse be protected at all times. EC and the HPAG wish to ensure that no unfit or unsound horse travels to or competes at the 2024 OG. All declared horses shall be subject to drug testing according to FEI drug and medication rules. Blood and/or urine samples may be drawn at any time throughout the qualification, nomination and quarantine / staging camp periods. Samples may be tested for the presence of substances identified by the FEI as both forbidden and/or controlled. Positive test results from samples collected during FEI competition will result in a zero (0) score for that athlete/horse combination in all classes at that competition. Athletes and owners are responsible and accountable for all positive testing results.
- ii. **Assessment:** An assessment for soundness and serviceability for competition will be conducted on all nominated horses including alternates, by the Team Veterinarian prior to the departure of the horses for the 2024 OG. Assessments will examine the overall soundness and serviceability for competition with consideration of the cause and prognosis of any recognized unsoundness. Following the final assessments, the Team Veterinarian shall provide a report to the HPAG either in person or via conference call. In the event a nominated horse is found to be unfit or unsound during assessment, they may be re-presented within a 24-hr period for re-assessment. Should the horse be unable to proceed to the 2024 OG, the HPAG will remove the horse based on Section 4.1 Substitutions below.
- iii. **Communication:** Throughout the nomination process, observations and concerns identified by the Team Veterinarian will be communicated orally or in writing to the athlete of the horse in question, and to the HPAG. The onus will be upon the athlete to take any necessary action to follow the recommendations of the Team Veterinarian.
- iv. Medical History: Open communication between the regular veterinarian, all treating veterinarians and the team veterinarian is encouraged, and in order to best help support and prepare horses for the 2024 OG, athletes/owners may be required to provide up to six (6) months of full medical history including all treatments, medications and supplements which have been given to declared horses. This history must be provided by the regular and treating veterinarian(s).

3. NOMINATION PROCESS

3.1 Nomination Panel

The HPAG is the nomination panel for the 2024 OG. The members of the HPAG can be found at https://www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage

No voting or non-voting member of the HPAG shall participate in any discussions or decisions regarding the nomination of any athletes with whom they have a perceived or real conflict of interest. Any member of the HPAG who considers that they are in a position of perceived or real conflict of interest must declare such a conflict before any discussions are held or decisions are made and must remove themselves from any meetings until the matter giving rise to the perceived or real conflict of interest has been resolved by the HPAG.



3.2 Specific Responsibilities

- The general purpose of the HPAG is to provide input and feedback into the development of the high performance strategy, policies (including criteria) and programming.
- Oversee the selection / nomination of Canadian athlete/horse combinations to represent Canada internationally.
- Develop a national ranking system for elite riders.
- Develop a mechanism for ensuring that the feedback and opinions of targeted athletes are represented in the key high performance policy and program decision making processes.
- Collectively act as a resource to the DHP on other high performance program areas, as requested.
- Support management in dealing with appeals and disciplinary actions related to dressage programs and selection / nomination.
- Provide strategic counsel to the DHP on matters concerning high performance programs and services.
- Review athlete development through objective assessment tools in collaboration with the Performance Analyst

3.3 Nomination Procedures

- 3.3.1 All qualifying Grand Prix and Grand Prix Special scores achieved by each athlete/horse combination throughout the QP (see *Appendix 1*, Section 2.1), will be used to calculate the combination's final ranking average. Exception, see *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3.2 below.
- 3.3.2 Athlete/horse combinations may discard a maximum of <u>one</u> qualifying Grand Prix <u>or</u> Grand Prix Special score from their final ranking average, however at least three Grand Prix and three Grand Prix Special scores from 2024 must be included in the final ranking average and at least one qualifying Grand Prix score and one qualifying Grand Prix Special score must have been achieved after <u>April</u> <u>1st</u>, 2024, see *Appendix 1*, Section 2.2.3.3.
- 3.3.3 The average of all qualifying Grand Prix scores earned during the QP (excluding any discarded score per *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3.2 above) will count for 80% of the combination's final ranking average.
- 3.3.4 The average of all qualifying Grand Prix Special scores earned during the QP (excluding any discarded score per *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3.2 above) will count for 20% of the combination's final ranking average.
- 3.3.5 Following the end of the QP (see *Appendix 1*, Section 2.1 above) the HPAG will review the final ranking average for all athlete/horse combinations.
- 3.3.6 For Canada to guarantee the nomination of a full team to the COC for the 2024 OG the final ranking average for the team must be 70% or higher.
- 3.3.7 Provided *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3.6 above is achieved, then nomination to the team will be determined as outlined below:
 - a) The athlete/horse combination with the highest final ranking average as per *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3.3 and Section 3.3.4 above will be nominated to the team for the 2024 OG.
 - b) The final two athlete/horse combinations nominated to the 2024 OG team, and up to two athlete/horse combinations named as alternates, will be nominated in an effort to identify and nominate the best possible team to represent Canada at 2024 OG. The HPAG will review and



evaluate athlete/horse combinations on the following non-exhaustive factors:

- i. Qualification scores, including the currency and consistency of the qualification scores, examples of which are:
 - a) Consistency of qualification scores from qualifying classes during the QP;
 - b) Whether qualification scores from qualifying classes reflect improvement over the QP;
 - c) Number of qualification scores obtained within the last 3 months of the QP; and
 - d) Consistency of qualification scores from qualifying classes at different venues, under different conditions, before different judges/panels.
- ii. The fitness, soundness and ability of the athlete/horse combination to contribute to a top 10 team performance at the 2024 OG;
- iii. The previous international experience of the athlete/horse combination, examples of which are:
 - a) Whether the athlete/horse combination has previously competed for Canada at a CDIO Competition or Major Games (Pan American Games, World Equestrian Games, Olympic Games) and the impact of their contribution to the team at such events;
 - b) Athlete's previous international experience and the impact of their contribution at such events;
 - Horse's previous international experience and the impact of its contribution at such events;
 - d) The CDI level (CDI 3*-5*) of the qualifying competition;
 - e) The international ranking of other athlete/horse combinations competing in the qualifying class

3.3.8 Extraordinary Unforeseen Circumstances

The HPAG may consider athlete/horse combinations that did not achieve the 2.2.3 Stage Three Qualification Score Requirements for nomination, but only under extraordinary, unforeseen circumstances. Extraordinary, unforeseen circumstances may include, without limitation, situations of temporary injury to either the athlete or the horse that are outside the reasonable control of the athlete, extreme weather causing cancellation of a qualification event, or unusual and unforeseen events occurring at a qualification event or preventing access to one or more qualification events or preventing one or more qualification events from taking place etc.

In the event of such unforeseen circumstances the HPAG will determine if the circumstances justify competition or nomination should take place in an alternative manner. In such circumstances, the HPAG shall communicate the alternative selection or nomination process to all declared athletes as soon as possible.

- 3.3.9 Should *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3.6 above not be achieved, nomination of a team or nomination of individual athlete / horse combinations to the COC for the 2024 OG will be subject to the decision and approval of the HPAG in consultation with the DHP and the DM, and in accordance with these qualification and nomination procedures and the Regulations for the 2024 OG.
- 3.3.10 Athlete/horse combinations will be formally nominated to the COC on or before the COC deadline of **July 3rd, 2024**.
- 3.3.11 Following nomination, athlete/horse combinations named to the 2024 Canadian Olympic Team plus named alternates, will be required to attend the 2024 OG quarantine staging camp. Confirmed details



for the 2024 OG quarantine staging camp will be communicated to all nominated athletes directly. The expected timelines for the quarantine staging camp will be between <u>July 14th – July 26th, 2024</u>.

4 SUBSTITUTIONS

4.1 Should the need arise prior to the start of the 2024 OG, substitutions shall be made as per FEI requirements for substitution and in accordance with this document. In the event of a conflict between these Nomination Criteria and the FEI and or 2024 OG rules, the latter two shall prevail. All substitution decisions will be communicated via email.

4.1.1 Substitutions After Nomination but Before the 2024 OG Quarantine / Staging Camp

Should the need for a substitution arise prior to the 2024 OG quarantine / staging camp the following provisions shall apply: if a nominated horse becomes unfit, ill or unsound such that it is, in the reasonable opinion of the Team Veterinarian, not possible or desirable to have that horse compete at the 2024 OG, or if a nominated athlete is ill, injured, incapacitated or engages in misconduct, including violation of the EC Athlete Agreement, EC Code of Conduct and/or EC Policies, FEI Policies or OCOG Policies, so that it is not possible or desirable for the athlete to represent Canada at 2024 OG, the HPAG shall have the authority to make all such substitution decisions after reviewing all relevant evidence in connection with any illness, injury, misconduct or unsoundness issues.

4.1.2 Substitutions During the 2024 OG Quarantine / Staging Camp

Should the need for a substitution arise during the 2024 OG quarantine / staging camp the following provisions shall apply: if a nominated horse becomes unfit, ill or unsound such that it is, in the reasonable opinion of the Team Veterinarian, not possible or desirable to have that horse compete at 2024 OG, or should a situation arise where an athlete/horse combination is underperforming during the 2024 OG quarantine / staging camp to the extent that, in the reasonable opinion of the HPAG, it is reasonably likely to have a negative impact on the team's performance during the 2024 OG, or if a nominated athlete is ill, injured, incapacitated or engages in misconduct, including violation of the EC Athlete Agreement, EC Code of Conduct and/or EC Policies, FEI Policies or OCOG Policies, so that it is not possible or desirable for the athlete to represent Canada at 2024 OG, the HPAG shall have the authority and absolute discretion to make all such substitution decisions after reviewing all relevant evidence.

NOTE: Substitutions from <u>July 3rd – 7th, 2024</u>, are subject to COC Team Selection Committee (TSC) approval and from <u>July 8th, 2024</u> onward, are subject to the OCOG Late Athlete Replacement Policy and COC TSC Approval.

4.1.3 Substitutions After Departure for the 2024 OG but Prior to the Horse Inspection

Should the need for a substitution arise after departure for the 2024 OG, but prior to the horse inspection the following provisions shall apply: if a nominated horse becomes unfit, ill or unsound such that it is, in the reasonable opinion of the Team Veterinarian, not possible or desirable to have that horse compete at the 2024 OG, or if a nominated athlete is ill, injured, incapacitated or engages in misconduct, including violation of the EC Athlete Agreement, EC Code of Conduct and/or EC Policies, FEI Policies or OCOG Policies, so that it is not possible or desirable for the athlete to represent Canada at 2024 OG, the Team Veterinarian and Chef d'Equipe shall have the authority and absolute discretion to make a substitution decision as per the FEI rules and the OCOG rules. The Team Veterinarian and Chef d'Equipe must both be in agreement and in support of the substitution in order for a substitution to be made.

NOTE: Substitutions from <u>July 8th</u>, <u>2024</u> onward, are subject to the OCOG Late Athlete Replacement Policy and COC TSC approval.



5 OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

5.1 The HPAG will privately inform the 2024 OG athlete/horse combinations including alternates of their nomination on or before **June 14th**, 2024.

Non-Disclosure Policy Regarding Team Announcement

It is important that ALL athletes nominated for the 2024 OG (as well as ALL owners, team personnel, and anyone else affiliated with a nominated athlete, including grooms, friends, and family) respect this Non-Disclosure Policy Regarding Team Announcement until after the official announcement of the team by COC.

Until the official COC team announcement, athletes and their affiliates (owners, team personnel, and anyone else affiliated with a nominated athlete, including grooms, friends, and family) are to refrain from confirming team nominations to any and all media, and should not make any references that confirms team nominations on social media (Facebook, Twitter, etc.).

The purpose of this non-disclosure policy is to ensure maximum impact and exposure for the announcement of the athletes who will represent Canada at the 2024 OG.

Violation of this non-disclosure policy may impact your nomination.

5.2 COC will officially announce the selected athlete/horse combinations. The date of the official announcement will be provided to the athletes when they are notified in writing of their nomination. There will be no mention of the nominations to the media or public until the official announcement has been made by COC.

7. MUSIC REQUIREMENTS

- As an athlete using music in your routine, you need to respect the legal rights in the music used. This applies to any sports discipline where music is a core element, such as artistic and rhythmic gymnastics, figure skating, synchronized swimming and dressage. If you are a parent or guardian of a child athlete using music, please read this guidance carefully on your child's behalf.

- 7.2 The music that you use during your routine may well be protected by copyright. The writers and performers of the composition, together with the person that recorded it, may well have legal rights in the music even if the music seems to be in the public domain.
- 7.3 As such, the music rights-holders are usually entitled to be paid for your use of the music. So, if the music is used without their permission and without payment of the relevant royalties, that would usually infringe their rights.
- 7.4 The first step is to obtain a copy of the music from a reliable and lawful source, such as a CD shop or legitimate online store (or the actual record producer direct if you have commissioned the music). You then need to provide details of the music to the organizer of the sporting competition.
- 7.5 For the right permission to be obtained from the music rights-holders (and for them to be paid the relevant royalties), it is critical that you provide the correct details of the music to the organiser.
- 7.6 The organiser is responsible for providing this information to the relevant collecting management organisations known as "CMOs". If the event is broadcast on television or online, the broadcasters need



to receive this information too, as they also need to provide it to CMOs. Based on this information, the CMOs can then collect any relevant royalties from the organiser and broadcasters and distribute the royalties to the music rights-holders.

- 7.7 To identify the music effectively, you need to provide the following information **by July 3rd, 2024,** see **Appendix 6:**
 - 7.7.1 Track list: list all music tracks that you are using, following the order of your routine (including warm-up tracks, if any).
 - 7.7.2 Track details: for each track, please provide the following details:
 - a) Title: state the full title of the track, as given in the track list of the record.
 - b) Duration: confirm the length of the track as used in your routine (minutes and seconds).
 - c) Artist(s): provide the name(s) of the singer, band, orchestra or other artist who performed the track.
 - d) Record label: give the name of the record label (or, if none, the name of the record producer).
 - e) Year of release: state the year of the track's first release to the public (or, if unreleased, the year it was produced).
 - f) Writer(s): indicate the name(s) of the writer(s) of the composition/lyrics.
 - g) Arranger(s): if the original composition has been altered, state the name(s) of the arranger(s) (or, if none, "N/A").
 - h) Publisher(s): confirm the publisher(s) of the composition (or, if none, state "copyright control").
 - i) Special commission: indicate if the track was specially commissioned by you (yes/no).
 - 7.8 You can obtain it from the packaging of the CD containing the music, or from the information appearing in the online music store where you obtained the music (which should also be embedded in the digital data for a download file). For tips on where to look, please refer to the examples set out on the ITUNES and CD pages of this website.

Where used in this document, unless otherwise defined, acronyms and capitalized words have the following meanings:

2024 OG means the 2024 Olympic Games in Paris, France;

Canadian Dressage team means the team of rider/horse combinations selected to represent Canada at the OG.

CDI means Concours de Dressage International (International Dressage Event) and has different levels, with the higher numbers meaning a higher level; the star ratings for events also relate to a number of other factors, such as the level of the judges present, the participation requirements and the prizemoney on offer;

CET means the Canadian Equestrian Team, as determined by Equestrian Canada;

COC means the Canadian Olympic Committee;

COC Agreement" means the athlete agreement or Support Team Agreement required by the COC to be completed for naming to the Canadian Olympic Team;

DHP means the EC Director High Performance

DM means the EC Discipline Manager

EC means Equine Canada operating as Equestrian Canada;

EC Games Portal means the internet registration portal for EC used for Major Games;
