

2024 OLYMPIC GAMES EQUESTRIAN CANADA SELECTION CRITERIA & PROCEDURES - JUMPING

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Internal Nomination Procedures (INP) for the 2024 Olympic Games (2024 OG) will be communicated through Equestrian Canada (EC) official publications, posted on the EC website and distributed by email to EC National Team Program (NTP) athletes.
- 1.2 The purpose of this document is to set out the nomination criteria and procedures (Nomination Criteria) that will be used by EC to nominate athlete/horse combinations to compete at the 2024 OG scheduled for July 26th August 11th, 2024 in Paris France.
- 1.3 Discipline specific Nomination Criteria are outlined in *Appendix 1*. Questions specific to the Nomination Criteria should be directed to the appropriate Discipline Manager (DM).
- 1.4 Athlete/Horse combinations must meet the expectations as outlined in these Nomination Criteria in order to be considered for nomination.
- 1.5 Athletes and owners who choose to participate in the nomination process acknowledge by their participation and declaration that meeting the requirements outlined in these Nomination Criteria does not guarantee that an athlete/horse combination will be nominated.
- 1.6 It is vitally important for the integrity of the nomination process that athletes, grooms, owners, team support personnel and associated parties involved in the nomination process, practice at all times a high degree of confidentiality relating to information which may have a bearing on nomination, and/or any nomination decisions. All confidential information, conversations, and discussions will be identified as such. Any person who breaks this confidentiality may be removed from the nomination process.
- 1.7 If there is a difference in interpretation between the French and English versions of this document, then the English version shall prevail.
- 1.8 Any intentional misrepresentation of information submitted for nomination consideration may in the sole discretion of EC, eliminate the athlete/horse combination from both the qualifying process and from consideration for nomination.

2. ELIGIBILITY

2.1 To be eligible for nomination consideration for the 2024 OG, the following minimum eligibility requirements listed in this section must be met.

2.2 Athlete

Be a Canadian citizen at the time of declaration and until the conclusion of the 2024 OG



- Have a Canadian passport that is valid until at least February 11th, 2025
- Be eligible to travel to any required quarantine/training camp and the 2024 OG
- Be in compliance with all relevant International Federation (FEI) and International Olympic Committee (IOC) requirements for eligibility
- Sign, submit and comply with the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) Athlete Agreement and Organizing Committee Olympic Games (OCOG) Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than <u>June 24th</u>, 2024. Where the athlete is under the age of majority in their province of residence, the parent or guardian must also sign these agreements
- Be a member in good standing (Platinum Sport Licence Holder) with EC
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable. Requirements will be outlined in the COC athlete agreement.
- Hold a current FEI Registration and be in good standing with the FEI
- Sign, submit and comply with the EC Athlete Agreement and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the Universal Code for the Prevention of Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS) and the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC)
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines
- Meet minimum athlete age requirements as per the 2024 FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events 25th edition ART 606.1:
 - o Dressage: 16 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2008
 - o Eventing: 18 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2006
 - o Jumping: 18 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2006

2.3 Horse

- Meet minimum horse age requirements as per the 2024 FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events 25th edition ART 606.2.1:
 - o Dressage: 8 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2016
 - o Eventing: 8 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2016
- o Jumping: 9 years of age in 2024, born on or before December 31st, 2015
- Possess a valid FEI Horse Registration document (passport) and be in good standing
- As per ART 606.2.2.1 must have been registered with FEI as property of Owners of Canadian nationality on or before 15 January 2024.

2.4 Groom

- Be a minimum of 18 years of age at the time of the 2024 OG
- Have a passport that is valid until at least <u>February 11th</u>, 2025
- Be eligible to travel to any required quarantine/training camp and the 2024 OG
- Have experience competing or grooming at international equestrian competitions
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines
- Sign, submit and comply with the COC Support Staff Agreement and OCOG Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than **June 24th**, **2024**
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable. Requirements will be outlined in the COC participant agreement



• Agree and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the UCCMS and OSIC.

2.5 Owner

- Have a passport that is valid until at least **February 11th, 2025**
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines
- At minimum one Owner must be listed as an owner in the FEI horse passport
- Sign, submit and comply with the COC Support Staff Agreement and OCOG Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than <u>June 24th, 2024</u>
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable
- Agree and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the UCCMS and OSIC.

2.6 Support Team Members

- Have a passport that is valid until at least February 11th, 2025
- Be eligible to travel to any required quarantine/training camp and the 2024 OG
- Provide all the information and documents necessary for the declaration, entry, and accreditation processes by the required deadlines
- Sign, submit and comply with the COC Support Staff Agreement and OCOG Conditions of Participation Form (Eligibility Conditions form for 2024 OG) no later than <u>June 24th, 2024</u>.
- Be in compliance with vaccination requirements and policies of EC, COC, FEI, IOC and the host country of the event, if applicable. Requirements will be outlined in the COC participant agreement.
- Agree and conform to all EC policies (including safe sport) regarding team preparation, training, and competition, including compliance with the UCCMS and OSIC.

Note: To access "P or Ao" (coach) Accreditations the coach must be a Registered or Chartered Professional Coach with the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC) Professional Coaching Program and meet any requirements established by the COC. Eligibility for a Registered Coach License includes a valid police records check, two professional references, safe sport training, an ethical conduct declaration and signing a license agreement.

3 DECLARATION AND ACCREDITATION PROCEDURES Declaration

- 3.1 **Deadline Date:** Athletes must submit a declaration for the 2024 OG to EC through the EC Games Portal on or before 12 midnight ET, November 3rd, 2023. Failure to submit the required information and documents by this deadline will make the declaration incomplete and invalid. No late declarations will be accepted except for already declared athletes in accordance with Section 3.8.
- 3.2 **Purpose:** The declaration date allows sufficient time for the **Accreditation Process** to be completed for athletes, grooms, owners, and support team personnel through the COC by the IOC deadlines for all possible athletes, grooms, owners and support team members.
- 3.3 Process: The declaration MUST be made through the EC Games Portal at

- 3.4 Fees: Declaration fees, if any, are outlined in *Appendix 1*.

At the time of declaration, the athlete MUST provide:

- 3.5 **Horses**: The name, FEI passport number, and FEI passport expiry date for each declared horse, Refer to Section 2.3 for horse eligibility.
- 3.6 **Grooms**: The name, unique e-mail address, and phone number for a minimum of two (2) up to a maximum of four (4) declared grooms in priority order. Athletes are responsible for ensuring that their groom is eligible (please refer to Section 2.4 for groom eligibility), kept informed, and available for the time commitments in the proposed schedule for 2024 OG (an expected four week commitment which includes any potential staging camp period). EC reserves the right to deem a groom ineligible for an international team competition. Should a groom not carry out their assigned duties and obligations or exhibit inappropriate behavior detrimental to the team, then EC has the authority to remove such groom from the team. Please refer to the discipline specific Nomination Criteria in *Appendix 1* for additional groom information, as applicable.
- 3.7 **Owners:** The name, unique e-mail address, and phone number for up to two (2) declared owners per horse, in priority order for accreditation purposes; at least one owner must be listed in the IF horse passport. In the case of syndicate ownership groups, declared athlete/horse owners do not need to be individually listed in the FEI horse passport, but must be individually declared in priority for accreditation purposes. Please refer to Section 2.5 for owner eligibility.
- 3.8 **Declaration Date Exception:** Except as set out in this Section 3.8 athletes may not submit a declaration after the 12 midnight ET, November 3rd, 2023 deadline.
- 3.8.1 In the case of a horse being made available to an already declared athlete after the declaration deadline to form a "New athlete/horse combination", EC may, in its sole discretion, accept this athlete/horse combination as a declared candidate for the 2024 OG.
- 3.8.2 Additional athlete/horse combinations must be submitted in writing to the EC Discipline Manager at the earliest date possible, and no later than <u>January 15th, 2024</u>. Note: Horse owner accreditation may not be possible for new horses declared after <u>12 midnight ET, November 3rd, 2023</u>. deadline.

Note: "New athlete/horse Combination(s)" are defined as either a:

- o new horse purchase
- o horse transfer to an already declared athlete
- 3.9 **Withdrawal**: Declared athletes who subsequently choose to withdraw from the nomination process (either themselves or their horse) prior to the naming of the team and alternates, must advise the EC Discipline Manager of their decision in writing.

Accreditation

3.10 **Process**: The accreditation process for the 2024 OG will be facilitated by EC and coordinated through the COC. To help facilitate this process, the athletes' declaration in the EC Portal must include the personal/unique e-mail addresses and phone numbers for all potential grooms and owners. Any



subsequent changes to accreditation details i.e. new owners, grooms etc., must be reported to the EC Discipline Manager immediately in writing. Athletes, grooms, owners, and team personnel are not permitted to apply directly to the COC or the OCOG for accreditation.

- 3.11 **Allocation**: EC has the exclusive authority to, nominate, and allocate accreditations for the grooms, owners, and team personnel who comprise the Canadian Equestrian Team (CET) to represent Canada at the 2024 OG. Accreditation for 2024 OG are limited and are allocated based on the needs of the entire team and on what EC feels will lead to the best team performance at the 2024 OG.
- 3.12 **Information Deadline**: Athletes, grooms, owners, and team support personnel are to provide all necessary accreditation information, including photos and passport details and personal information, in the COC Portal in accordance with the process and the timelines of the COC and EC.
- 3.13 **Longlist:** It is very important that information is provided and entered in the EC Games Portal for EVERY possible individual who may attend the 2024 OG in an accredited role (Athlete, Owner, Groom, Team Personnel, etc.). Participation in this process does not guarantee accreditation nor nomination.

Release of Liability Waiver

- 3.14 All declared athletes, grooms, owners, and team personnel must complete and return the release of liability waivers to the EC Discipline Manager by **April 1st**, **2024**. Exception see Section 3.8 (new athlete/horse combinations). The waiver and release forms can be found in the following appendices:
 - Appendix 2: Athlete Release of Liability, Waiver of Claims, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement
 - Appendix 3: Groom/ Team Personnel Release of Liability, Waiver of Claims, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement
 - Appendix 4: Owner Release of Liability, Waiver of Claims, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement
 - Appendix 5: Release of Veterinary Medical Records (Dressage only)

4 ANTI-DOPING AND DRUG TESTING

Athlete

- 4.1 **Eligibility**: The athlete must not be under suspension or any other sanction by any recognized body for any doping or doping-related offense.
- 4.2 **Testing**: Declared athletes may be subject to announced and unannounced drug testing in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and EC rules and regulations. Testing includes both in-competition and out-of-competition testing. All athletes who declare for the nomination process must provide accurate and up-to-date contact information through the EC Sport Licence portal.
- 4.3 **Deemed Violation**: Athletes who do not provide up-to-date contact information or respond to EC communications, will be considered in violation of these policies. Violations will be considered in context by the Discipline's High Performance Advisory Group (HPAG) and may result in the disqualification of the athlete from the nomination process.



Horse

- 4.4 **Testing**: All declared horses shall be subject to drug testing according to FEI drug and medication rules. Blood and/or urine samples may be drawn at any time throughout the qualification, nomination and quarantine/training camp periods. Samples may be tested for the presence for all prohibited and/or controlled substances by the FEI.
- 4.5 **Prohibited Substances**: In the event a prohibited substance is detected, the amount of this substance will be quantified where possible and reported to the EC Discipline Manager. Any horse whose sample contains a prohibited substance or a restricted substance in a concentration greater than the allowable IF limits may be eliminated from the nomination process by the HPAG. Positive test results from samples collected during FEI competition will result in disqualification of that athlete/horse combination in all classes at that competition.

5 APPEALS

- 5.1 **Grounds**: Athletes participating in the nomination process for the 2024 OG have the right to appeal against a nomination decision but only on the grounds that the HPAG has failed to comply with the correct procedures outlined in the Nomination Criteria or has made a patently unreasonable decision based on the Nomination Criteria. An appeal must be made in writing to the Independent Third Party Complaint Manager within 72 hours of the relevant athlete being informed of the decision. Appeals must be accompanied by an administration fee of \$750.00(CA) as per the published EC Schedule of Fees. - 5.2 **Process**: In recognition of the short timelines required for the nomination decision process, any appeals to decisions made under the Nomination Criteria will proceed under the Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC) appeal process. The administration fee referred to in Section 5.1 will be applied to the fee required for the appeal to SDRCC. All appeals must be resolved prior to July 8th, 2024 at 4:59 pm EST.

6 AMENDMENTS TO THE NOMINATION CRITERIA

- 6.1 The Nomination Criteria are based on applicable FEI, COC and OCOG regulations, conditions and restrictions as currently known and understood, and on the latest information available to EC. https://inside.fei.org/fei/games/olympic/paris-2024. Any changes in the Nomination Criteria necessitated by a change in FEI, COC or OCOG regulations will be distributed via email to the declared athletes as soon as reasonably possible. Should such a circumstance occur, EC will review and may amend Nomination Criteria to comply with the new regulations or conditions. Any amendments to this document will be communicated directly to all declared athletes via email. Communication will be sent to the email address provided in the EC Games portal.
- 6.2 Further, situations may arise that do not allow this Nomination Criteria to be modified or applied as written due to time constraints or other exceptional and unforeseen circumstances. In such situations, any decision, including nomination decisions, will be made by the individual(s) with decision-making authority, as stated in this Nomination Criteria, in consultation with the relevant individual(s) or committee(s) (as applicable), and in accordance with the stated performance objectives and nomination philosophy and approach as stated herein. Should it be necessary to make any decision in this manner, EC will communicate with all declared athletes as soon as possible.



APPENDIX 1 - JUMPING SPECIFIC NOMINATION CRITERIA

Olympic Games scheduled for July 27 – August 11, 2024 in Paris, France (2024 OG) (Jumping - July 31 – August 6)

1. INTRODUCTION

EC plans to nominate to the COC either an individual or a team of up to the maximum number permitted to compete in the jumping competition for Canada at 2024 OG (Canadian Jumping Team).

1.1 If sending an Individual:

One (1) athlete/horse combination and two (2) additional athlete/horse unofficial reserve combinations will be nominated to COC.

1.2 If sending a Team:

Four (4) athlete/horse combinations comprising a team of 3, plus 1 official reserve athlete/horse combination will be nominated. Three (3) additional athlete/horse combinations will also be nominated to COC as unofficial reserves.

1.3 Performance Objective:

The performance objective for the Canadian Jumping Team at the 2024 OG is a podium finish.

2. PRINCIPLES FOR SELECTION

- 2.1 EC will select the most competitive athlete/horse combination(s) to represent Canada. Competitiveness, rather than participation at the Games will be stressed.
- 2.2 Past Major Games experience and/or results will be a contributing factor in selection.
- 2.3 Performance analytics during the Nomination Window (as defined in *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3 below) of usable Nations Cup scores as defined in the National Team Program criteria (4 faults or less) will also be a consideration.
- 2.4 Percentage of clear rounds at FEI competitions during the Nomination Window (as defined in *Appendix 1*, Section 3.3 below) as defined for a Squad in the National Team Program Criteria, will also be a consideration.

3. INTERNAL NOMINATION PROCEDURES

- 3.1 The EC High Performance Advisory Group (HPAG) is comprised of the following members: *Ian Millar (Chef d'Equipe)*, *Gail Greenough*, *Mike Lawrence*, *Marni Von Schalburg and Tiffany Foster*. The EC High Performance Director and Discipline Manager assists the HPAG in their execution of the duties in an ex officio position.
- 3.2 By declaring, athletes and owners of horses eligible for nomination to the 2024 OG agree to make themselves and their horses available if selected and confirm their willingness to comply with the team preparation plans as set forth by the Chef d'Equipe, while always keeping the best interest of the team in mind.



- 3.3 All horses and athletes that take part in 2024 OG must achieve as a combination, the MER required at selected events which take place from Sunday, January 1, 2023 until Monday, June 24, 2024 (the "Selection Window").
- 3.4 Qualification system and MER selected events are available here; https://inside.fei.org/fei/games/olympic/paris-2024
- 3.5 Once selected to the CET for 2024 OG, athletes must submit all competition and travel plans, for approval by the Chef d'Equipe.
- 3.6 In selecting the CET for 2024 OG, it is understood that the individual HPAG members may be in a real or a perceived conflict of interest position. Notwithstanding this, they shall remain as a member of the HPAG. Members with a conflict of interest shall declare their conflict of interest (real or perceived) in advance. Any member of the HPAG who has declared a conflict of interest will remove themselves from all discussions in which there is a conflict and will abstain from voting relating to until such conflict is resolved.
- 3.7 GROOMS: The groom must be able to make independent knowledgeable decisions on the care of the athlete's horse. Riders are responsible for ensuring that their selected grooms are qualified, kept informed and are available for the time commitments in the proposed schedule for the 2024 OG program. All selected grooms are subject to the direction and authority of the Chef d'Equipe and/or Team Manager.

4. SELECTION

- 4.1 The HPAG shall nominate the CET for 2024 OG, that in the opinion of the Group and in the exercise of its sole discretion, can best represent Canada at the 2024 OG. Nomination will be based on relevant factors to be considered by the HPAG including performance within the Selection Window, previous experience of horse and/or athlete, perceived reliability of horse and/or athlete to jump courses of Olympic Games scope and technicality, and perceived durability and soundness of horse.
- 4.2 The performance of all declared candidates may be monitored and considered at any shows they participate in during the Selection Window.
- 4.3 Candidates for 2024 OG are strongly encouraged to participate in the following shows where members of the HPAG may be present. Candidates not participating in the following competitions without good reason may be removed from the nomination process.
 - 4.3.1 The Winter Equestrian Festival held in Wellington, Florida or the Desert Circuit held in Thermal, CA.; and
 - 4.3.2 The Spruce Meadows Summer Tournaments, Calgary, Alberta, CSI 5* June 6-9 and CSI 5* June 12-16, 2024
- 4.4 Tight deadlines and logistics of sending the CET to the 2024 OG necessitate that, on or before Monday, April 1, 2024, the list of individual and/or team athletes will be narrowed down to the top five (5) individuals or up to the top eight to twelve (8 to 12) team candidates, as applicable, making up the long list that will be nominated to the COC.



- 4.5 These combinations will be nominated by a majority vote of the HPAG based on the Nomination Criteria. In the case of a tie amongst the HPAG, it will be broken by the Chair.
- 4.6 The CET for 2024 OG will be nominated as the Definite Sport Entries on or before_ the deadline of July 3rd, 2024.
- 4.7 Once nominated to 2024 OG, athletes will be required to make sure their horses meet all quarantine and vet requirements necessary to compete at 2024 OG. These requirements will be communicated by the Chef d'Equipe and/or the Team Veterinarian.

5. CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR NOMINATION

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- 5.1 **Policy Compliance:** All athletes who have declared and met all required Nomination Criteria within the Selection Window must continue to conform to all EC policies regarding team preparation, training, and competition in order to remain eligible for nomination.
- 5.2 **MER:** To be eligible for 2024 OG, athletes must ensure that they are qualified and have achieved their Certificates of Capability (MER). All candidates must have achieved their respective MER no later than **Monday**, **June 24**, **2024**.
- 5.3 **Drug Testing:** All athletes may be subject to announced and unannounced drug testing according to the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) and EC Rules and Policies. Testing includes both incompetition and out-of-competition testing. Please note that EC Policy requires that any athlete representing Canada in a major championship must have had a drug test in the previous twelve-month period.

OBLIGATIONS ONCE NOMINATED

- 5.4 **Inspection**: Once named as one of the Definite Sport Entry athlete/horse combinations, the HPAG or its Chair may require a veterinary inspection at any time prior to departure for 2024 OG. A member of the HPAG has the right to be present at such an inspection. The HPAG or its Chair may require such inspection to be conducted under FEI Drug & Medication rules. After **July 3, 2024**, any medication or veterinary procedure administered to a horse on the 2024 OG Definite Sport Entry list must be promptly reported to the Team Veterinarian no later than 72 hours following administration.
- 5.5 **Required Consent:** Upon arrival at the competition training site and/or the competition venue, **NO** other vets or clinicians may examine or treat a Team horse without the express consent of the Team Veterinarian and only in the presence of the Chef d'Equipe and/or Team Veterinarian.
- 5.6 Medical History: Open communication between the regular veterinarian, all treating veterinarians and the Team Veterinarian is encouraged, and in order to best help support and prepare horses for the 2024 OG athletes may be required to provide up to three (3) months of full medical history including all treatments, medications and supplements which have been given to declared horses. This history must be provided by the regular and treating veterinarian(s).



5.7 **Equine Health:** Athletes and grooms are expected to cooperate fully with the Team Veterinarian and Chef d'Equipe at all times. The Team Veterinarian and/or Chef d'Equipe may ask to examine and/or jog a Team horse at any time provided either the athlete and/or the groom of the horse are present. The Team Veterinarian and/or Chef d'Equipe may request the presence of either the athlete and/or groom at a specific time and failure to provide full cooperation may result in disciplinary action, including removal from the Team.

Spur marks, it is recommended that the hair on the side of the horse should be grown out to help avoid the possibility of elimination of the horse/rider combination as per the FEI Rules.

- 5.8 **Quarantine/Training Camp:** There will be a mandatory quarantine/training camp (inclusive of the equine quarantine requirements) prior to the 2024 OG to help build positive Team atmosphere and spirit between, CET members, grooms, and support personnel. The quarantine/training camp will include veterinarian work where necessary and then final training preparations prior to departure for the 2024 OG.
- 5.9 **FEI Compliance:** Athletes are responsible for ensuring that their horses are in full compliance with current FEI Drug Rules. Horses may be tested for drugs according to FEI Drug & Medication rules.

6. SUBSTITUTIONS

6.1 Substitution of an athlete/ horse combination nominated as Definite Sport Entries to the COC with a named reserve athlete/horse combination shall be made as per FEI requirements (see https://inside.fei.org/fei/games/olympic/paris-2024) and in accordance with this document. In the event of a conflict between these Nomination Criteria and the FEI requirements, the latter shall prevail. All substitution decisions will be communicated via email.

The last date for substitution is the last date at which an athlete or horse selected to travel to the 2024 OG can be subject to substitution with a reserve athlete or reserve horse not previously nominated to travel. The date will be based on when the Canadian horses travel to the 2024 OG, where they travel from, and whether the athlete/horses are taking part in Pre-Export Quarantine Training Camp prior to departing to the Event. Horses will only be allowed to travel to the Event with the Official designated horse shipping company, or as a team in private transport arranged by EC.

- 6.2 A substitution may be required in the following:
- 6.2.1 if a nominated horse becomes unfit, ill or unsound, such that it is, in the reasonable opinion of the Team Veterinarian in consultation with the Chef d'Equipe, not possible or desirable to have that horse compete at 2024 OG;
- 6.2.2 if a combination is underperforming during the pre-2024 OG quarantine/training camp to the extent that, in the reasonable opinion of the Team Veterinarian and Chef d'Equipe, it is likely to have a negative impact on the Team's performance during the 2024 OG; or
- 6.2.3 if a nominated athlete is ill, injured, incapacitated or is in violation of the EC Athlete Agreement, EC Code of Conduct, an EC Policy, a FEI Policy or a 2024 OG OC Policy or Non-compliance with WADA or FEI Equine medications. Any substitution for medical reasons must be certified by a physician. The final decision for substitutions of a horse will be made by the Team Veterinarian and Chef d'Equipe with respect to any horse fitness, soundness or welfare issues. The Chef d'Equipe



shall have the authority and absolute discretion to make all such substitution decisions after reviewing all relevant evidence and in consultation with the athlete.

6.3 DECLARATION OF STARTERS

The declaration of starters will be done in accordance with the FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events https://inside.fei.org/fei/disc/jumping/rules The declaration of starters will be made by the Chef d'Equipe.

6.4 SUBSTITUTIONS DURING COMPETITION

In the team competition, substitution of a combination at the 2024 OG would be in accordance with FEI regulations for Equestrian Events._ https://inside.fei.org/fei/disc/jumping/rules The substitution decision will be made by the Chef d'Equipe.

7. OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

The Discipline Manager Jumping will privately inform 2024 OG athletes (including alternates) in writing of their nomination on or before <u>July 3rd</u>, 2024.

Non-Disclosure Policy Regarding Team Announcement

It is important that ALL athletes nominated for 2024 OG (as well as ALL owners, team personnel, and anyone else affiliated with a selected athlete, including grooms, friends, and family) respect this Non-Disclosure Policy Regarding Team Announcement until after the official announcement of the team by the COC.

Until the official COC team announcement, athletes and their affiliates (owners, team personnel, and anyone else affiliated with a selected athlete, including grooms, friends, and family) are to refrain from confirming team selections to any and all media, and should not make any references that confirms team selections on social media (Facebook, Twitter, etc.).

The purpose of this non-disclosure policy is to ensure maximum impact and exposure for the announcement of the athletes who will represent Canada at the 2024 OG. Violation of this non-disclosure policy may impact your selection.

COC will officially announce the selected athlete/horse combinations. The date of the official announcement will be provided to each athlete at the time of notification of their selection. There will be no mention of the selection to the media or public until the official announcement has been made by COC.
