<p><b>Conformation:</b> The quality &amp; correctness of head, neck, saddle position, shoulder, frame, back, forehand, hindquarters, angulations &amp; formation of legs &amp; joints.</p>	<p>Substance, condition, durability, heritable faults which affect soundness, trainability or breeding. Emphasis on function, not fashion. Penalize transmissible weaknesses, unsoundness or limitation in quality of movement. Blemishes are not to count unless results from conformation faults. Good harmonious conformation suitable for producing dressage performers.</p>	10	X 4		
<p><b>Movement:</b> <b>Walk:</b> Four even beats; straight &amp; even strides, correctly aligned steps, articulation of joints, freedom of shoulders &amp; haunches, balance, elastic &amp; swinging back, overstep reach, ground covering with marching quality.</p>	<p>Purity and quality (judged mainly in profile). Correctness (judged mainly coming to and going from judge)</p>	10	X 2.5		
<p><b>Trot:</b> Two even beats; straight &amp; even strides, correctly aligned steps, articulation of joints, freedom of shoulders and haunches, balance, elasticity, swinging back, natural engagement &amp; impulsion from hindquarters, suspension, power from upward thrust &amp; roundness.</p>	<p>Purity and quality (judged mainly in profile) Correctness (judged mainly coming to and going from judge) Movement should be big, light and springy.</p>	10	X 2.5		
<p><b>General impression:</b> Include appropriate gender impression, development related to age, typiness, alert, expressive &amp; well-mannered.</p>	<p>Quality, balance, harmony. Suitable as a sport horse.</p>	10	X 1
